

It is with great sadness that I heard that my Mentor Mr John Firmage FIT had recently passed away.

I was extremely fortunate to have been trained and mentored by John Firmage (and Keith Hobbs) at The Scalp and Hair Hospital in Brixton and at The Battersea Scalp and Hair Clinic. John's encyclopaedic knowledge of Trichology and his finely honed clinical skills were legendary amongst all who were fortunate enough to experience them.

When I observed John's consultations it was a Master Class in professionalism.

He had great skill in putting the patient at ease and of extracting clinical information from them seemingly effortlessly. Of course, it wasn't. It was years of experience and a genuine dedicated vocation to do the very best he could to care for the patient. He always observed the ethical oath that the Patient must always come first above all personal or commercial interests. I have never forgotten this.

John's abiding legacy will be that he was always willing to selflessly share his knowledge with students and members alike. He generously helped other Members when called upon for a second opinion and gave much support to newly qualified Members to enable them to make their own success in the profession.
